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According to a news report from 2014, about 135,000 children are estimated to be trafficked in India each year. Trafficked children are sold into slavery, domestic servitude, beggary and for so many illegal activities. Children are kidnapped and often even bought from remote villages, more from impoverished families.



The child trafficking industry is India's greatest shame and yet very little has been done about it in terms of policing. In a number of states, powerful cartels manage trafficking, buying off parents and the police to keep away legal restrictions. According to Childline India, some 1,000 to 1,500 children are smuggled from India to Saudi Arabia each year to beg during the Hajj.







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Trafficked children mostly are from social backward people. So EOC of Sapthagiri College of Engineering has conducted awareness program among the children of social backward community.

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

Report:

As per the direction of Principal, a team of faculty and student volunteers organized "NO HONKING DRIVE IN TRAFFIC" at traffic signal near college. The Program was organised and co-ordinated by Prof. Prashanth (ECO Club) in association with Health club and Community club along with students from both Community and Eco club.

According to the Karnataka State Pollution Control Board (KSPCB), the sound levels of horns should not exceed 84 decibels.

- A car horn's average decibel level is nearly 110dB, which is a serious health hazard as any sound above 60–70dB can result in gradual loss of hearing.
- Noise pollution has become such a serious problem in cities that ENT specialists say that most of the urban population suffers from 20dB hearing loss.
- If a person has chronic exposure to sound above 55dB, the risk of heart disease and stroke increases. As per a WHO study, "One million healthy life years are lost due to traffic noise."
- The problem is worst at traffic signals where drivers start honking without waiting for the signal to turn green or for traffic to move. Drivers show no respect to the law that prohibits the use of horn at traffic signals and other silent zones such as areas near hospitals, schools, religious places and

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residential areas. Vehicular honking in cities has reached at an alarming level and contributes approximately 70% of the noise pollution in our environment. According to an recent article of TOI, Four years ago, the city traffic police launched a campaign to get Bengalurean's to start every week sans loud, unnecessary honking. The police recently relaunched the 'No Honking Monday' campaign but it is clear the call has fallen flat and citizens continued to be - as the police would say -'horn-y'.

SCE has initiated a MOVEMENT against honking. Our battle plan includes putting up 'No Honking' banners, distributing pamphlets, stickers ETC..


TEMPLE CLEANING

The NSS team was also learnt few Yoga positions and we also understood the importance of ancient practices in modern life. The NSS team was also suggested to convey this message to the villagers




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
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SWACHH VILLAGE

We also recognized the difficulty they were facing when they tried to communicate in English and hence, we chose to teach them basic English.




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
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TEACHING ENGLISH

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
HESARAGHATTA LAKE CLEANING



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HEALTH CAMP FOR VILLAGERS







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
