Preamble :

In Govt. Order Dated : 17-09-94 read (1) above, Govt, have formulated reservation policy for Schedule Casts and Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes for admissions to professional courses for the year 1994-95 as per the lists of castes enclosed thereto as follows :

CATEGORY-I	4%
CATEGORY-II (A)	15%
CATEGORY-II(B)	4%
CATEGORY-II(A)	4%
CATEGORY-II (B)	5%
SCHEDULED CASTES	15%
SCHEDULED TRIBES	3%

- Under the said order Dated : 17-09-94 it has also been stated that no person other than belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Category-I of Backward Classes shall be entitled to the benefit of reservation for admission to professional courses unless he/she satisfies the conditions of the creamy layer specified there under.
- In G.O. Dated : 31-01-1995 read at Sl. No. 2 above, the aforesaid reservation and creamy layer policy envisaged in the order Dated : 17-09-94 read at Sl. No. (1), has been made applicable to the employment too, under Article 16(4) of the Constitution of India.
- In G.O. Dated : 14-02-96 read at Sl. No. (3) above the Creamy Layer Policy existed as on 01-01-95 for the purpose of admission to the

This Authority is constituted to enforce the standards and procedures prescribed by the State Government to be followed by the Association of unaided Private Professional Educational Institutions non- minority or minority, as the case may be, and to supervise and oversee the admissions made by the said Institutions. In order to ensure that it is fair, transparent and non-exploitative.

It is seen that in the ongoing admissions there are instances of many aberrations, especially in the matter of collection of fees. In this regard Consensual Agreements have been entered into between the Government of Karnataka and the following Associations namely:

- (i) Association of Minority Professional Colleges in Karnataka,
- (ii) The Karnataka Linguistic Minority Professional Association,
- (iii) Karnataka unaided Private Engineering Colleges Association,
- (iv) Karnataka Professional Colleges Foundation.

-in the matter of seat sharing and fee structure.

- (i) In so far as **Engineering and Architecture Courses** are concerned, the Consensual Agreements prescribe the following fee structure and percentage of seats :

51	“Self-Financing Institution” means an Institution started by a Trust/ Society/ Company and does not receive grant/ fund from Central and/ or State Government/ UT for meeting its recurring expenditure.
52	“Standing Hearing Committee (SHC)” means a Committee constituted by the Chairman as per the composition given in Approval Process Handbook 2018-19 to review the Reports of Expert Visit Committee/ replies received for Show Cause Notices.
53	“Single Shift/ Regular Shift” means where, educational activities of the Technical Institution are conducted between 9 am and 5 pm.
54	“Society” means a Society registered under Societies Registration Act, 1860.
55	“State Level Fee Committee” means a Committee notified by the concerned State Government/ UT Administration for Regulation of fee to be charged by the Technical Institutions.
56	“Supernumerary Seats” includes TFW, OCI/ PIO/ Foreign Nationals/ Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries, Lateral entry, PwD and J&K Seats notified from time to time, over and above the “Approved Intake”.
57	“Technical Campus” means a Campus which offers more than one Technical Programmes approved by the Council.
58	“Technical Institution” means an Institution set up by Government, Government Aided and Self-Financing/ Trust/ Society/ Company for conducting Course(s)/ Programme(s) in the field of Technical Education, training and research in Engineering and Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture, Planning, Applied Arts and Crafts, Hotel Management and Catering Technology, MCA, Management, and such other Programmes and areas as notified by the Act.
59	“Trust” means a Trust registered under the Indian Trust Act, 1882 as amended from time to time or any other relevant Acts.

What is Super Numerary Quota (SNQ)?

5% of the seats in each college and in each course will be reserved as Supernumerary Quota in all Engineering Colleges. This quota is over and above the seat matrix issued by the Government. For Example, if there are 120 seats in Computer Science in a particular college, the Supernumerary quota for Computer Science in that particular college will be 6 seats. Therefore the total intake in that college for computer science will be 126. The tuition fee prescribed by the Government in that particular college will be waived off. The candidate has to pay the other fees only. This Supernumerary quota is not available for Architecture Course. All candidates including General Merit are eligible for allotment of seats under Supernumerary quota.

How do I become eligible to give an option under Supernumerary Quota?

If the parental annual income is less than income prescribed by the Government for Supernumerary quota seats, then such candidate has to produce the Income Certificate issued by the jurisdictional Tahasildar which should be submitted at the time of verification of documents in order to become eligible for allotment of Supernumerary Quota seats. These seats will be allotted in the order of merit and options entered by the candidate.

Can I give option for both regular and Supernumerary Quota Seats?

There is no need to give separate options for Supernumerary quota seats. While allotting the seats the software will consider Supernumerary quota seats first for allotment if seats are available and if the candidate is eligible for it.

How is Supernumerary Quota seat allotted?

Seats up to maximum of 5% of sanctioned intake per course in each college approved by AICTE will be offered as Supernumerary seats. The software is designed in such a manner that while considering the options entered by the candidate for allotment, the priority in engineering options will be considered first against the Supernumerary Quota seats if seats are available in the order of merit as per candidate's eligibility.

As per Government Order No. ED 72 TEC 2013, Bangalore Dated 23-05-2014, the Supernumerary Quota Seats will be offered as detailed below:
